LOOKING BACK AT 2009, LOOKING FORWARD TO 2010

Rector's Report for Annual Meeting 2010

"We must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of every one of you for one another is increasing."

~2 Thessalonians 1:3

The year 2009 has been a year of great change for Holy Cross. Moving into our new worship space on Palm Sunday was the culmination of years of hard work and careful planning. I want to thank Drayton Gaillard for his untiring devotion to the process and his calm demeanor in the face of all our struggles. Our average Sunday attendance rose from 244 to 274 this year—a 12 percent increase in average attendance. Our membership team tells me that we handed out 85 new cross-stitched name tags in 2009!

The building is built, people are coming to join us, but there is still much to be done. We are currently servicing a 1.75 million dollar mortgage (which includes the balance of the Academy loan) and it will have a significant effect on our ability to do ministry in the future if we do not pay it off quickly. Our Stewardship folks are looking at all the possibilities for making this "bill" go away.

In the meantime, we are finding that ministry here at Holy Cross is changing rapidly. Our Program Council will be meeting in February to have a workshop on roles and responsibilities. Our vestry is aware that we will need to lean heavily on the people of the Program Council to accomplish those day-to-day tasks that require oversight and regular

attention. As we move more fully into the program model* of doing ministry, we will need to let go of the “old ways” of doing ministry and look for new opportunities for including others into the system. Many of us may feel that “someone is moving our cheese”, but these new ministers will allow us to continue to welcome those who are not yet members.

We have a unique calling at this time and in this place as a program-size parish. More than 65 percent of all churches are 100 or less on a Sunday. Our size transition puts us in the unique position of being able to do ministry that other Episcopal churches cannot do; to offer programs that other churches cannot offer.

With these realities in mind, this year we will be focusing on “growing smaller as we grow larger.” Our emphasis will be on creating and sustaining ministry groups that will allow one another to grow in grace and in ministry. Our goal is to be certain that every member has a place at Holy Cross where they belong. Please watch carefully for opportunities to participate with one another in growing our faith journeys.

*Editor’s note: A program church, the next step in growth for a pastoral church, has between 150 and 350 active members with many cells of activity headed by lay leaders. Clergy are still at the center of the program church, but their role has changed. Much of their time must be spent planning with lay leaders to ensure the highest quality programs. PRACTICING THE FAITH: “I’VE BEEN WONDERING”

Holy Cross offers many services and tries to meet many needs within our parish and community. Has an occasion arisen when you didn’t know who to contact or how? Here are some questions that are occasionally asked and the answers. (Note the contact information at the bottom.)

- **Should I call a priest?** If you are asking the question, perhaps you should. We especially want to hear from you if there is a crisis, you are facing surgery, a baby is born, or there is an impending death in the family. Father Mike generally takes pastoral care calls on Tuesdays and Fridays, and Mother Linda on other days. Call the church during regular business hours; use our cell phones at other times for emergencies.
- **I would like a home visit?** Home visits are made by the clergy and lay ministers, as well as our parish nurse. Call the church office to schedule a visit or email [Pastoral Care](mailto:PastoralCare).
- **How do I add a name to the prayer list?** The parish prayer lists—members, family and friends, pregnancies and members of the armed forces—are maintained by our secretary. Names remain on the members and family and friends lists for a month. After that time, please call and give an update. When you give us the name of a

member of the armed forces, please tell us their relationship to you and where they are stationed. If you'd like a Holy Cross Cares package sent to them, give us their mailing address as well.

- **What is Caring Connection and what kind of care does Caring Connection offer?** Caring Connection is the name given to our pastoral care network at Holy Cross. Members of Caring Connection write cards; provide meals after surgery, the birth of a child or a death in the family; rearrange the altar flowers and deliver them to sick and home bound members as well to local nursing homes; provide some members transportation to church; send packages twice a year to college students and military personnel; visit in hospitals, homes and nursing homes; and take communion to parishioners who are unable to worship with us on Sundays.
- **I am unable to drive to church. Is transportation available?** We do have a small but growing ministry of transportation. To ask for assistance or to volunteer to help, call the church office or email [Pastoral Care](#).
- **I know someone in the parish who would benefit from a card, a visit, some flowers, etc. Who do I contact?** Call the church office or email [Pastoral Care](#).
- **How do I add my name to the E-blast list?** Call the church office or send an email to our secretary, [Judy](#).
- **Can I get the weekly parish news updates without signing up for the E-blast?** The information sent out on Thursdays is usually posted on the parish web-page and can be accessed by going to www.holycrossep.org and clicking on "Events."
- **Is Crossways, the monthly Holy Cross newsletter, available in printed format?** Yes. You can pick up a copy from the credenza in the narthex, or call the church office and ask to have a copy mailed to you.
- **My phone number, address, email address or marital status has changed. Who do I tell?** Please give the new information to [Judy](#) in the church office.
- **I've moved into a new home. Can I have it blessed?** Yes, call the church office to schedule a time for Father Mike and/or Mother Linda to come celebrate with you and share the liturgy of the blessing of a home. We can also share in the blessing of living space in an assisted living community or nursing home.
- **We want to be married at Holy Cross. What do we do?** A Holy Cross Wedding Guide is available in the church office. Contact [Judy](#) or stop by the office to pick up a copy. Please do this as soon as you decide to be married and before a date is set.
- **What is the significance of cross-stitched name tags?** People who have attended Holy Cross long enough to consider this their church home and who indicate through worship attendance, participation and expressing a desire to be part of our parish are given a cross-stitched name tag. If you are ready to make that commitment, tell one of the greeters, or call the church office.
- **I've been coming to Holy Cross for a while, and I want to become a member. What must I do?** Stop by the visitors' table in the narthex on Sunday morning and pick up a copy of the "Membership at Holy Cross" information sheet, indicate your desire on one of the cards in the pews, or call the church office.
- **I want to get involved in a ministry at Holy Cross. What do I do?** Vestry members wear "Vestry" cross-stitched red name tag and can be approached with your questions on Sundays. You can also find a "Ministries and Programs" link on our web site. After clicking on "Ministries and Programs," you will find email links to the leaders of our various ministries.

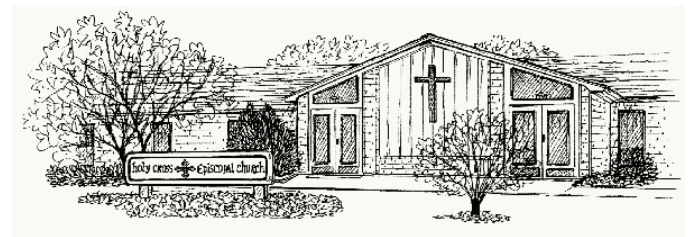
Heather Devine will be setting up the Christian Formation rooms for Sundays, and Kristin Beal will be sending out the lessons to the teachers and

FIRST COMMUNION CLASS

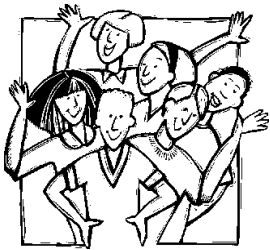

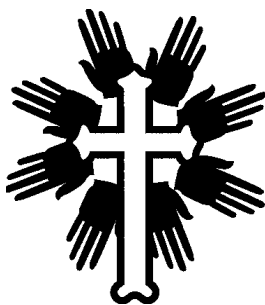
