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## GROWING PAINS

At this late age I am discovering that pain is the price we pay for growth. It is the pain we feel when we deny ourselves the easy way out and instead choose to take the longer, steeper road that leads to wholeness and inner peace.

We had a conversation at breakfast the other morning where one of our parishioners was told by a Roman Catholic: "You don't have a crucifix in your church." When she insisted that we do, the RC insisted that it was not possible. In her mind Protestants don't use crucifixes. There is a history here wherein the Reformers saw the veneration of relics and crucifixes as idol worship and thus eliminated all images of Christ and saints and "purified" the church. The colonization of the United States began with those "Puritans" who sought to find religious freedom from the established churches (that included the Church of England). Thus, statues of saints and crucifixes were seen as potential idols in the Reformed church. So no, you won't see a crucifix in a Presbyterian or Baptist church. But for us, the crucifix is a symbol of the real, physical, earthly pain suffered by Jesus on the cross. It is a reminder for us that Jesus was willing to make painful choices in order to reconcile us with God.

The bad news is that we too are going to have to make painful choices if we will fully live into our lives as followers of Jesus. We too will have our "crosses to bear" as the old adage goes.

I spoke with a friend before Deb left who had lived through a deployment with her husband. She said it was the hardest thing she had ever done and their marriage is stronger now than it has even been because of what they have been through together.

12 step literature says, "Pain is the threshold through which we enter into a new life."

Holy Cross is in the process of entering into a new life and we are feeling

the pain of that process. Our Vestry is experiencing the pain of change as they let go of the day to day operations of the church and focus on our future and our structural changes. The Program Council is experiencing pain as they begin to grasp the size of the task in which they are involved. Our committees and groups are experiencing pain as we struggle to find places and times to meet and the time to get it all done, plus the pain of having multiple ministries operating simultaneously and our members having to choose between ministries. We have been saying it for several years now and it is true – “Growing Pains” - but these are pains that will lead us to a fuller life in Christ as the Episcopal church in the Golden Strip.

God is at work here, and we are participating in the work of God. And sometimes it is going to hurt. But our option is to bear the pain of shrinking numbers and dollars and ministries and Spirit and fail to fulfill God’s call for us in this place or to bear the pain of growth and confusion and change, and become what God has called us to become – a community of faith that Makes Christ Visible wherever we are called to serve.

## PRACTICING OUR FAITH – READING SCRIPTURE – PART 2

*They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?"*

(Luke 24: 32)

*For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. (Romans 15:4)*

Many of you signed up to participate in the Bible 2012 Invitation and Challenge, and some others have told me you are reading the Bible but are on a different plan or program. I am thrilled. If you haven’t started yet, it is never too late to begin and I’ll offer whatever encouragement you need. I delight in hearing about your journey through scripture.

Some of what I’ve heard include these comments and questions:

“I’ve already gotten farther than I ever have before – I’m so proud.”

“I always heard that Noah took two of every animal; I never heard that he took sever pairs of the clean animals!”

“That story about Dinah – whoa! I have lots of questions about that one!”

“All these lists of descendants...why were they so important? Mostly I just skim through them. Is that okay?”  
[Yes, that is okay!]

“I’ve heard these stories all my life, but I never knew where to find them in the Bible. Now I know that ‘Moses and the burning bush’ is in Exodus!”

“Why did Jesus tell people not to tell others about him and what he had done?”

When you read the Bible this way, you make all kinds of discoveries. You notice things that escape you when you hear it read in small segments on Sundays, and though we do read much of the Bible in a three year cycle on Sundays, some parts are never read – the story of Dinah, for example.

Everyone who reads scripture has their own response to the text. Pray before reading that the Holy Spirit will speak to you in the words of scripture. Dwell with it a while. Ask what it is saying to you today. Don't worry that what you hear may not be what you've been taught or heard preached. Listen for God's message for you today.

The overarching theme of the Bible is the incredible, amazing story of God's love and God's actions and interactions with the people of God in making that love and grace known. As we read scripture, we seek both to know that story and to become a part of that story.

The Bible is a story of journey – the Israelites, the disciples, the early Christians – the story of how individual people and a people, a nation, were changed through their interactions with the God who sought them. As we read and pray with scripture, as we study and discuss the scriptures, we can recognize our own journey with God. We, too, will be transformed by the living God we find there and who finds us when we turn to him there. May God bless, encourage, challenge, call, transform you, and give you hope.

*Reminder* – I am meeting with all interested persons in the parish hall to discuss what we are reading in scripture on the 2nd Monday night at 6:30 (Feb 13) and on the 3rd Tuesday morning at 10:00 (Feb 21).

## YOUTH LEADERS NEEDED

I hear this comment all the time, “I’ve served my time.” I don’t hear this comment because I’m spending time with former prisoners, though that may be an important thing to do. Rather I hear it from church members. It doesn’t matter if I speak to an Episcopalian, a Baptist, or a Methodist. It doesn’t matter if I’m trying to recruit someone to serve or if I am introducing myself. As soon as people hear that I’m a youth minister or as soon as I ask them to volunteer, they said, “I would never do that. I’ve served my time.”

I’m not really sure what people mean when they make that comment. I can only imagine that they are telling me that they have raised their own teenagers and because of that experience they don’t want to work with teenagers again. It is hard to imagine, though, that all of these people have served as youth leaders themselves. Perhaps they have helped with youth group by chaperoning some events or providing food when needed. Those things are very different than being a youth leader, though. First of all, parents have to live with teen drama, smells and messes 24/7. Youth leaders get to send them home at night (well most nights anyway). For the most part, youth are on their best behavior with us. We are present with them for short periods of time, sharing snippets of our life. Youth come to us because they want to learn and they want to be with us. For some youth, youth group is the only place they feel safe and loved all week long. Those reasons alone make being a youth leader very different from being a parent.

Youth leaders are people who show up, listen and tell the truth. They are people willing to “be” with the youth, listen to their stories, and truthfully connect it to God’s story. Youth leaders are companions and confidantes who join youth on their spiritual and emotional journey from childhood into adulthood. It is a rewarding journey. Many of the youth who I first began this journey with fourteen years ago still remain in contact with me. Seeing them become adults, become married, become parents and even a couple to become youth leaders has been an incredible experience.

Youth leaders do not need to be young, cool, or even on top of the latest trends. They just need to care. Over the years, I have found that youth react and relate the best with adults who are often their grandparents’ age. I don’t know if this is because most youth do not live near their grandparents anymore, but this age group especially seems to be able to connect to youth.

Youth also like young adults as well because they always bring a vibrancy and energy that some of us older leaders have lost over time.

Whatever your age, we need youth leaders right now. We need people willing to be with our youth and to accompany them on this journey. If you are willing to be with the youth as they do activities on Wednesday nights, prepare for confirmation, serve our community, or learn on Sunday mornings, please let me know. Even if you could be present with them one day a month, it would be valuable to our ministry and their lives at this time.

If being present is not your gift, I also need people to plan activities for youth that another adult can implement.

During baptisms, we promise to support our children in their life in Christ. Would you consider supporting our youth in an active way? Would you consider being a youth leader or a planner? If so, please contact me at 967-7470 or youth@holycrossep.org. I would be willing to sit down with you to discuss your gifts and how they may be used to support our youth.

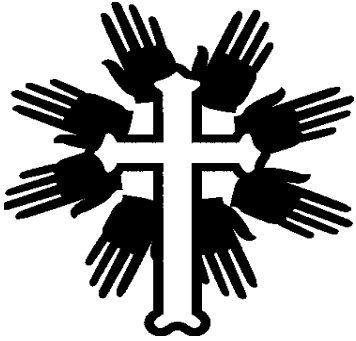
