





Our regular Thursday choir rehearsals will resume on August 31 at 7:00 pm in the Sanctuary.





Announcement: A Support Group for Those Experiencing Loss





The images and stories from the tragic wildfires in Maui have been heartbreaking and shocking. In addition, many parishioners have shared with me their memories from visits to Maui, including to local Episcopal parishes, such as Holy Innocents in Lahaina.

If you feel so inclined and are looking for a avenue to support the Maui and Lahaina communities, the Episcopal Diocese of Hawaii has provided us with helpful information.

GOAL Update

In August 2022 Holy Cross joined with other congregations to push for social justice in Greenville County. This movement became GOAL, Greenville Organized for Accountable Leadership. Throughout 2022 and 2023 Holy Cross members gathered in homes and churches to help determine what social justice issues to address, find solutions, and make local leaders accountable. Our thanks to everyone who gave their time, prayers, and money to improve the lives of those in need. Below are the successes of our efforts, as stated by Aidan Workman, GOAL leader.

Housina:

At our Nehemiah Action, GOAL received commitments to work towards \$10MM a year for affordable housing, with at least one third for low income households. Since then, Greenville County passed a budget including **local** dollars for affordable housing for the first time ever! While the County is not yet at \$10MM annually, the budgeted \$5MM is an amazing step forward. This success is due to your showing up at the Nehemiah Action.

GOAL also followed up with city officials and has support from the mayor and several councilors to increase affordable housing spending to just over **\$8MM** in the next budget! The funding is not secured yet, but again, your presence at the Nehemiah Action is making these discussions possible.

Mental Health:

At the Nehemiah Action, GOAL asked attendees to contact Chairman Bruce Bannister, and because you followed through, GOAL met with him in April and secured his commitment to fully fund the 988 Crisis Care number in this

year's budget. With the State Budget now passed, we are excited that the funding is in place for 988 to have increased staffing and be able to answer the high volume of in-state contacts. Our mental health committee continues to work on next steps to ensure that 988 remains funded in future years. Thank you for your support!
